SCHOOL COUNSELLOR

This year we have a new School Counsellor joining our team at Black Hill PS. Miss Emily Coutts will be working with us 1 day a fortnight on a Friday (odd weeks). As our school counsellor, Emily will be working with students, parents, and teachers to provide support and guidance on a range of social, emotional, and behavioural issues. She brings a wealth of experience and expertise to our school, and I know she will make a positive impact on our students' well-being and success. At Black Hill PS, we are committed to supporting the social, emotional, and academic growth of all our students. Emily will be a valuable addition to our team and will help us continue to provide a nurturing and supportive learning environment for our students.

DEFIBRILLATOR

A huge shout-out to our P&C for their recent purchase of a defibrillator for our school community. This life-saving equipment will be a valuable addition to our school's first aid facilities and will help ensure the safety and well-being of our students and staff. A defibrillator is a device that can help restore the heart's normal rhythm in the event of a sudden cardiac arrest. With its prompt and effective use, a defibrillator can significantly increase the chances of survival for a person experiencing a cardiac emergency. Our defibrillator was delivered to our school yesterday, and we were fortunate to receive additional training from a representative of the Royal Life Saving Society.

Thank you to our staff and community who attended this training. At next Tuesday's P&C Meeting, we will be discussing the most suitable location to house our defibrillator.



SCHOOL ACTIVITIES AND INFORMATION

NAPLAN

Our students in Year 3 and Year 5 will be undertaking their NAPLAN assessments next week and the week after. NAPLAN (National Assessment Program -Literacy and Numeracy) is an annual assessment

that measures students' literacy and numeracy skills in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9.

As mentioned previously, from 2023 the NAPLAN assessments have been moved to an earlier time in the year (from May to March). The tests cover a range of skills, including reading, writing, language conventions, and numeracy.

Our Year 3 and Year 5 students will be undertaking their NAPLAN assessments on the following days: Wednesday 15 March – Writing

Thursday 16 March – Reading

Monday 20 March – Conventions of Language (Spelling, grammar, Punctuation)

Tuesday 21 March – Numeracy

We want to encourage all students to attend school during the testing period and to be wellrested and nourished. It

is also important for parents to support their children by providing a calm and supportive environment at home and emphasising the importance of students just doing their best. It is important to remember that NAPLAN is just one measure of a student's academic progress and that it does not define their abilities or potential. At Black Hill Public School, we are committed to supporting all our students to reach their full potential and achieve success in all areas of life. We wish all our students the best of luck with their NAPLAN testing and look forward to celebrating their achievements and progress throughout the year.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON ASSEMBLY

It has been wonderful to see so many of our families attend our Friday afternoon assemblies. This is a great opportunity for parents and carers to come and see their children showcase their talents and achievements in a supportive and inclusive environment, and to celebrate and acknowledge the fantastic learning happening at our school.
